In his seven-year tenure on the dairy farm, he has used his proficiency in Spanish and passion for building relationships to develop those around him and has led the multicultural team through an aggressive expansion from 1,400 cows to a multi-site operation milking over 2,500 cows.

Paul earned his bachelor's degree in Animal Science from Cornell University and is a graduate of LEAD NY, a two-year leadership and professional development program focused on the agricultural industry.

He serves as his county Farm Bureau vice president and has also served on several state committees, including the YF&R Committee. Paul was the 2017 state winner of the Excellence in Agriculture Award.

Paul and his wife Caitlin, a high school history teacher, live on their family farm with their young daughter. Together with his father and grandfather, three generations farm together to produce hay and raise Hereford beef cows.
